Tēnā Koutou Katoa, Greetings to you,

Good is more than the absence of bad.

We frequently hear that Lent is a preparation for Easter. It is a time when we repent of our sins and strive to become a better person. We might "give something up" for Lent. We might do something extra for Lent. Through these acts we are trying to be a better person and to make amends for our sins.

We also know that Easter marks a time when Jesus died to save us from our sins. I have also been to the sacrament of reconciliation where I confessed my sins (bad things that I have done) and received forgiveness. Combining this knowledge with the sacrifices that I had made during Lent, I should now be a better person and possibly even a good person. That Easter egg is something that I certainly deserve for being good.

As a child, I was sometimes promised a reward for being good. I learnt that not doing anything bad was usually enough to get the reward. In essence, if I did not make life difficult for others, a reward would come my way. Good, I thought, was as easy as not doing anything bad.

We might label someone as "bad" by looking at the tally of unpleasant things that they do. In contrast, we might consider that we are a good person because we do very little bad. Unfortunately, that opinion gets a roasting from Jesus. Those who had focused upon being law-abiding, generous and well-behaved had no justification for labeling others as being bad or sinful people (Matt 7:).

Sin is not a series of misdeeds that we become aware of when we compare ourselves to others, or some cultural or legal ideal. Misdeeds are the consequence of sin and not sin in itself. Sin is both a verb, something that people do, and it is also a big umbrella under which all of humanity exists. Sin exists as a power that enslaves all of us and must be given the boot. The crucifixion (Good Friday) is when this first happened and humanity was provided with a means to be reunited with God.

However, we cannot redeem ourselves from the domain of sin by being good. Only God can redeem us via his amazing grace. The crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus shows us that the reign of sin can be overcome. There is a way forward for the salvation of all, which we understand is to be united with Christ.

Now I appreciate that good is more than the absence of bad. Good demands that we are an active respondent to the world around us. There is a communal side of good which cannot be ignored. Good (and God) requires us to act in the interests of others to support a world of justice, peace and joy. Doing nothing therefore, cannot be considered as having done something good. It's more likely to deliver something bad.
