Tēnā Koutou Katoa, Greetings to you,

Sometime soon our Board of Trustees will need to review our current mission statement and possibly write a new one. A mission statement is useful as it expresses the purpose of our College. It provides us with a focus for the alignment of plans and decisions for the Board of Trustees and the Principal.

When the early Christian Church had to write its first mission statement, it provided us with the Apostles and Nicean Creeds. It would have been reasonable to expect some reference in the mission statement about the amazing things that Jesus did or said. Maybe include something about the Sermon on the Mount, reference a few miracles such as curing the blind man or calming the storm, or possibly some well-known parables and exorcism events. What about his message of love and hope for humanity? That must be a key thing to include in the mission statement.

What is really notable in both Creeds, is a complete absence of reference to any of the above. The only thing we are told about the life of Jesus was that he suffered. We find a similar message in the earliest writings of the Church, that we know as the "letters" or "epistles".

The very strong message that was being conveyed to us was that the most significant thing about the life of Jesus was that he suffered, died and rose again.

Mainstream religion, and society in general, prefers to avoid suffering. There is little room for accepting that suffering is part of our human condition. We want to avoid it as much as possible. We want to have goals without the need for trust and risk of failure. We want to feel optimistic and full of well-being without a conversation with despair. We want success without pain and light without darkness. We want control without recognition of our hopelessness.

I see this played out in the lives of many today. Parents who do as much as they can to lessen the possibility and reality of suffering in their own lives and those of their children. People who join a Church because its message is upbeat and focuses upon the wonderful things that Jesus did during his life. A strong connectivity into selected social media, to create a safe place for oneself full of like-minded people. We all want Easter without Good Friday.

The suffering of Jesus was not just an event associated with the day before his crucifixion. Suffering was present throughout his whole life on Earth. He lived with it, managed it, and loved others through it. We are told that when he returned from 40 days in the desert, he was offered an option of life without suffering. Stones into bread, power beyond imagination, certainty over doubt. He rejected all of this because this is not the reality of humanity. How could his message for humanity carry truth unless he was truly human and suffered as we suffer?

It is not possible to live a life without suffering. We cannot insulate ourself from suffering by building walls around us, any more than the butterfly. If we try to do that, we do not flourish into becoming adults. Sometimes there is just no answer to suffering and no justice available in this world. We can't bring people back to life, the scam cannot be undone, the scar cannot be hidden, the virus cannot be defeated. However, the message that Jesus gives us, is that suffering is not terminal.

There is an Easter Sunday for us all and we can experience some degree of it on Earth today.

That is the ideal of the Church in communion with each other and with Christ. The Church is a place where we should encounter Christ in each other, in the Word, in the role of the Priest and in the Sacraments. It should be a place where our suffering is reduced, but not removed, because we are people with eyes set beyond this time, full of the hope that Easter promises to us.

ICAS COMPETITIONS

Years 7 - 11

We are delighted to inform you that Pompallier Catholic College will be participating in the world-renowned ICAS competition this year.

What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problemsolving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals.

We encourage you to consider entering your child into ICAS this year.

How to participate in ICAS:

If you wish for your child to participate in ICAS this year, please:

- Read about ICAS subjects and prices here
- Read the terms and conditions <u>here</u>
- Go to Parent Portal to purchase tests here
- Enter our school's access code MDH962
- Enter your child's details, select the tests you would like to purchase, then proceed to payment.

After payment is made via the Parent Payment System, you will receive an order confirmation email, please keep this for your records.

ICAS Results and Certificates:

We will notify you of the date(s) that we run ICAS at the school and when your child's ICAS results are ready.

Once we have received your child's ICAS certificate, we will send it home with them. The back of the certificate shows ICAS results and the login details, "TAP ID and Pin", that you and your child need to enter the Results Portal: orti.icasassessments.com/ortiStudent


