Tēnā Koutou Katoa, Greetings to you,

We state that we are a Catholic school with a Marist charism. In essence this means that we participate in the mission of the Catholic church (to bring about God's Kingdom), in a way that reflects how Mary engaged in this task.

Our students and staff frequently make reference to aligning behaviour with what we know about Mary. In particular, with what we know from scripture and tradition about Mary and her interaction with Jesus and his disciples.

It is possible to fill in some of the gaps in the story of Mary with what we consider to be highly probable. This has happened for thousands of years and we find it expressed in art, architecture, symbols, waiata, writings and oral traditions. Much of this content is not seeking to convey a historical truth, but to convey a particular teaching or tradition associated with Mary.

We consider Mary to be the first disciple of Jesus. She devoted her life to educating and caring for her son in his formative years and later in life she supports his mission and the emergence of the Christian community after his death and resurrection.

There are strands of Mary's teaching associated with the nature of Jesus, the nature of sin, and how Jesus saved humanity from the power of death and sin. This teaching is not always evidenced in the scriptures. It arises overtime as the Church comes to a more complete understanding of Christ and his mission. When it discerns something that it considers to be true for all of time, the Church proclaims that teaching as dogma. Sometimes this is declared by the teaching authority of the Church, or a gathering of Bishops.

The Pope (Bishop of Rome) can also declare a teaching to be dogma. When the Pope does so, he can speak *ex cathedra*, which means that the teaching is without error. Catholics often think that there must be many occasions when a Pope speaks authoritatively and without error about some teaching of the Church. In reality, the Popes have only twice stated some teaching as being without error. Both of these teachings were about Mary. They are the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption.

The feast of the Assumption is celebrated on 15th August each year. It has a particular significance to us because Bishop Pompallier, at his first mass in New Zealand, dedicated his mission and the care for its people in New Zealand to Mary under the title of her Assumption to heaven. This was 112 years before Pope Pius XII declared the dogma on the Assumption of Mary.

For hundreds of years, the Church understood that Mary had devoted her life to the serving God. She gives birth to the God made man. She nurtures and guides his mission and is within him at the crucifixion. Having been so united with her son, the Church discerned that she would also be with him in heaven, continuing this journey with her son.

How did this happen? Did she head into the heavens before or after she died? The Pope did not answer that question. Pope Pius XII simply said about Mary that, "after finishing the course of her life on earth, was taken up in body and soul to heavenly glory." People get fixated on images of Mary heading to heaven as some celestial being, but in doing so they miss the key teaching. The truth being taught is that she continues to support the mission of her son while she is in heaven. She is not dead and entombed on earth waiting for the coming of Christ.

Asking the assumed Mary to be an advocate for New Zealand and its people was an inspired choice made by Bishop Pompallier in 1838. Given that we carry the name of the first Catholic Bishop of New Zealand, we too seek this ongoing support from Mary for our College.

IMPORTANT BUS INFORMATION ...

We have a stretched loading system for most of our bus routes.

All students have a Student ID card, which shows which bus they are eligible to catch. **Passes must be produced every time when boarding their allocated bus.** We operate a **"No Pass No Ride"** policy. Please note that bus drivers will be vigilantly checking passes, and if a student is unable to produce the correct pass for that bus, they may be refused travel and have to make their own arrangements.

Eligibility for buses are dependent on where a student lives, and available public services in the area. Please note that variances to student travel may be made in **emergencies** only, and with approval from the school. The Ministry of Education provides transport, in the form of bus services, to and from a students place of residence, and **not their after school activities**.

It is also vital that we have the correct up-to-date address for your child. If you have changed addresses, please inform us immediately via admin@pompallier.school.nz to ensure their eligible bus route and Student ID are updated and they are not refused travel for being on the incorrect bus.

If your child loses their bus pass, they can apply for a replacement by paying \$6.50 to the College office. A temporary pass will be issued at the Student Centre, and a new one will be ordered for them.
