SPORTS - CODE OF CONDUCT

General:

- Play within the spirit of the rules.
- Self-discipline is required loss of temper at games or training, and use of unsavoury language will
 not be tolerated.
- Accept the Umpire's decisions as final. Any concerns or queries to be raised with either your Team Coach, Manager, or Team Captain, during the interval or at the conclusion of the game, whichever applies first.
- Be a good sport. Recognise good play from your opponent.
- Treat all players as you yourself would like to be treated. Don't interfere with, bully, or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Remember the aim of the game enjoy it, give it your all.
- Co-operate with your Captain, Coach, Manager, teammates and opponents, for without them you
 would not have a game.
- Training times are set down by the Coaches of the respective teams and all players must be prompt.
 If for any reason you are unable to attend a training session, the player must notify the Coach or Manager at least one day prior to that particular training session.
- All players must respect the authority of the Coach and Manager in all aspects of the game.
- All players are encouraged to express any concerns or views they have in regard to any aspect of training, and Coaches must ensure that the environment is there to do so.

Dress Expectations:

- No jewellery or watches permitted.
- Pompallier sports socks to be worn, if applicable to sport code.
- Appropriate footwear MUST be worn.

Uniforms:

Sport uniforms are the property of the College. Each player will be given a uniform at the beginning of the season. During that time, it will be their responsibility to take care of the uniform.

Any disrepair may result in a payment to the school.

Correct uniform must be worn at all times.

Pompallier Catholic College must not be brought into disrepute by non-adherence of the above Code, and should this happen to occur, it may result in expulsion of the player from the team.
