A favourite story of mine in the Bible is the story of Hosea. It is not a long story as far as Bible stories go and was written a little after the reign of King Solomon. King Solomon was well known for having married many women. Almost 100, it is said. Some of the women were locals, others were from foreign lands. Over time he grew a reputation for wisdom (he would need it) and was a well-respected leader.

However, in marrying into a diversity of families, Solomon did allow for the introduction of a range of faiths. Into a culture of monotheism (one God) comes many gods and a diversity of worship practices and holy sites.

This diversity of faiths became problematic for a nation whose sense of identity was based on monarchy and monotheism. Things started to fall apart in the little nation. People started to make comments about Hosea and his disrupted life and children at home with no mother.

The telling thing about Hosea was that he did not give up on the promise he made before God. He had promised to love and commit his life to his wife no matter what happened. Fires and floods, travel and overnighters, nothing would shake his commitment. But it seemed that God was not doing much for him when it came to his unfaithful wife.

The years went past, people found new gossip, and time took its toll on the physical beauty of his wife. One day, Hosea is at the market and sees a recently arrived group of slaves for sale. There were a few women in the group, including one that looked as if she was somewhat worse for wear. Hosea recognised this woman and immediately placed a bid on her that nowadays resembled paying Auckland prices for a Kaitaia house. His mates thought he had lost the plot.

Not surprisingly, he was successful in his bid and the woman came to live in his house. Maybe now he would be happy again. The new woman was very grateful to have a new home. She cleaned herself up, got some mud out of her eyes and suddenly realised that she had been reunited with her husband. She sought his forgiveness and cried many tears of sorrow. There was a little bit of self pity but most of this was genuine remorse at having broken their pledge to each other. Hosea's relentless love for her brought her back. OVERDUE LIBRARY & SUBJECT BOOKS


There are a number of overdue library books, and subject textbooks outstanding.

STUDYLINK 2024

Apply before 16 December you can't miss it.

If you're studying in 2024, 16 December is a very important date. It's one you just can't miss.

Around 120,000 students will need to get organised for study in 2024. Apply for your student allowance or loan before 16 December to give yourself the best chance of having everything sorted and ready for the start of your course.

If you've had a student allowance or loan in the last 12 months, login to MyStudyLink and use the Returning Application to apply. It'll take less than five minutes.

If you wish to reserve a locker for 2024, or keep your current locker, you will need to fill in an online order form at: www.stowawaylockers.co.nz as soon as possible.
