Tēnā Koutou Katoa, Greetings to you,

The number forty (40) has a rather checkered history. It has become associated with a time of life when men, and sometimes women, evaluate their life and make choices not usually aligned with prior decision making. A new car, new boat or new hobby might arise. There might be a change in haircut, mood, and physical activity. Some of you may have experienced this already.

Like many other things, forty also has a biblical tradition. Along with the numbers seven and three, we find it associated with many significant events and revelations. Forty represents a generation in the bible. It is used to reference a period of time in which a group arises and declines. This made good sense considering most people in those times had died before they hit forty years on earth.

Forty is the number of years that God kept the Israelites in the wilderness after Moses led them out of slavery in Egypt. It took forty years for the generation of "God doubters" in the camp to die off. Only then was the nation of people ready for the promised land. Sometimes God keeps us hanging around before revealing his intention.

The three Kings of Israel, Saul, David and Solomon, all reigned for forty years. Twenty years of prosperity was followed by twenty years of self entitlement and decline. Each of them stayed around too long and became fixated upon themselves and their potential dynasty at the expense of the people they served.

God's early clean up in the world took forty days. God was annoyed by humanity's bad behaviour and the destruction of the environment. A reset was required. For forty days and nights it rained. Every living thing was destroyed but for that which was on God's ark built by Noah. When the rain stopped and the water went down, Noah and his family and two of everything hit the ground again. God made a covenant that he would never hit the flood reset button again and thus established a new relationship that had been lost at the Garden of Eden.

The Principal of Pompallier Catholic College has educated teenagers for forty years. Some of that time has been associated with floods, fasting, doubt and new relationships. Physically there has been twenty years of ascendancy followed by twenty of decline. Mentally, I hope it has been in one direction only. It has been a biblical generation with former students now parents of current students. It is now time for a reset.

The three most significant men in the bible, Moses, Elijah and Jesus, all fasted for forty days. We are told that they took no food or water and relied solely on the intervention of God in their life. This test of faith was aligned with specific problems each was facing. Moses was on a loyalty test and at the end received the ten commandments. He understood the will of God a lot better than when he started out. Elijah did some critical thinking and came up with a plan on how to lead the people of Israel. Jesus is offered popularity, power, and permanence by Satan if he aligns with his mission on Earth rather than the mission of God. Lucky for us he declined the offer.

At the start of humanity, Adam was enticed with an offer to become like God while Jesus was enticed with the offer to remain as God and not become human. Join with me (Satan) and together we can rule the world. Adam accepted, and the world started to fall apart. Jesus declined and so began the period of time when the world can now realign with God. The possibility is now before us.

Like most God things, we are given the freedom of choice. The way of Jesus and God is based on love and freedom. There is no compulsion evidenced in the choice to align with God's Kingdom. Some might hope for an authoritarian God who compels allegiance and behaviour, but history shows us that the strong man approach does not work in nations or families.

The way of God requires love and patience to bring about transformational success. It is a road that is far more challenging to walk, but it is ultimately the only one that works. Whether it be forty seconds, hours, days, weeks, months or years, God calls us into relationships that can transform the world if we welcome God back into our life. The season of Lent and the celebration of Easter is a great place to get back on the road again.



ATTENTION ALL BUS USERS!!

I Most students have now been issued with Student ID I cards that show which bus they are eligible to catch. I Please note that variances to student travel may be I made in *emergencies* only, and with approval from the I school. The Ministry of Education provides transport, in I the form of bus services, to and from a students place of residence, and **not their after school activities**.

We appreciate parents understanding that it would be impossible to manage, organise and maintain safety on an already stretched loading system, to enable students to use any bus they wanted to get to their wide and varied after school activities. Please make your own arrangements in these cases. Students are able to access 2 fare-paying services - Route 1 and the Citylink-Maunu service. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

If your child loses their bus pass, they can apply for a replacement by paying \$6.00 to the College office. A temporary pass will be issued, and a new one will be ordered for them.



FAMILY SUPPORT ...

We would like to introduce you to our Family Support person for Pompallier Catholic College and St Francis Xavier Catholic School, **Rosie Ponifasio-Hughes**.

This is Rosie's fourth year with us. She has a background in teaching and community work. Her role involves attempting to remove any barriers that are preventing our young people getting the most out of their schooling... for some families that's support to help cover the basics (food, clothing etc), and for others, it's more moral support and a listening ear as our families navigate the bumps in the road that life throws at us all. The absolute highlight of her job is walking alongside so many promising young people AND having the privilege of making close connections with our amazing families.

Rosie currently works Monday – Thursday, from 8.30am to 3.00pm, primarily based out of St Francis Xavier Catholic School. Her office is at the school end of the church carpark, in the building right next to the Parish office - up the little ramp and into the Family Support room.



Rosie operates on an open door drop in policy, and would love to have you join her for a cuppa and chat anytime! This is open to all whānau from both our schools. 
- A confidential, non-judgemental listening ear regarding whatever's going on at home. I can also provide tailored links to other agencies or specialist services who may be able to offer support.
- I have hot drinks, chocolate bikkies and comfy chairs in a toddler friendly/breastfeeding friendly space at SFX - all welcome!
- I am happy to meet families up at Pompallier, do home visits, or converse via email, text, WhatsApp or phone.
- I can offer support to whānau experiencing bereavement, illness, separation, new baby, changes in family circumstances etc.
- I can work alongside families who are struggling with the basics, to help them access food, clothing, uniforms, stationery, housing, and advise on Work & Income subsidies and other wrap-around supports specific to their situation.
- I can help some of our families who are new to the area get settled in and get connected with local organisations.
- I can help source funding or find a way to make things happen for specific projects or special children.
- I can help Caregivers fill out applications/ paperwork, and if needed, support families to navigate new school systems and processes and offer moral support at school based meetings.
