Tēnā Koutou Katoa, Greetings to you,

I have always found finishing at any school one of the most difficult things to do. It is not about those last few tasks, for that is easy as the essential work has already been done. Instead it is about recognising that there are imperfections, failings and needs that remain which might never be addressed or may never be noticed by others. The tasks may have been done well according to students, staff and families, but inevitably it falls short of the need to "be perfect as your heavenly father is perfect" (Matt 5:48).

As I leave this College after 15 years, I know that it does have a reputation for being a highly respected and sought after school. That might be appealing as we like being associated with a winning team. However, reputation should never be a goal of education. As soon as reputation becomes the goal, students are no longer the most important people in the school. Staff are no longer valued for who they are, but for what they might contribute to the reputation. Truth is no longer important, as it becomes subservient to getting the right story out to people. Trying to hold onto reputation is one sure way to lose, it as it undermines the very purpose of education.

The strength of this College arises from it being a failure. It has failed because it tried to do its best for every single student irrespective of their unique set of needs. It has failed because it tried to be a Catholic school that lived out the key virtues of faith, hope and charity. It has failed because it tried to be a school that operated by the principles of social justice and the teachings of the Catholic Church.

Aiming to "be perfect as your heavenly father is perfect" is impossible to achieve. Perfection is for God alone. But the pursuit of perfection is necessary for generating something that is good. By seeking the best possible outcome for each student and striving to live as a Catholic community as a staff and student body, we inevitably failed and yet succeeded in becoming a very good school. I feel honoured to be part of that failure.

Moving on when the task of education is never finished is difficult. To some extent this can be remedied by starting again, but there inevitably comes a time when there is a need to walk other roads. Jesus got to say, "It is finished" (John 19:30) and he was probably the only person who could ever make such a claim.

As a young boy my mother would often ask me, "Have you finished?" when I was engaged in some task. My answer then is my answer now, "Almost finished Mum", and she would respond, "Leave it, and come and have your dinner". Thanks Mum, thanks Pompallier Whānau, it's time for my dinner.

To the students both current and past who have made everyday one in which I have felt blessed to work with you. Thank you for your cards, letters, notes and emails, and for the appreciation expressed by your presence and words. Thank you for the wonderful painting that captures so much of what I love about this school.

To the staff who have served the students of this College today and in the past. Your willingness to uphold the mission of the Church and to care deeply for our students, expressed in so many ways, has been an inspiration for me every day. Thank you for the words, letters, cards, hugs and tears and the amazing generous gift of yourself.

To the parents who have blessed us with their most precious people over the years. The journey that many of you walk with courage, faith and hope through difficult times has been an inspiration to me and challenged me to be a better person. Thank you for trusting me to work with such wonderful teenagers who bring God's presence to us every day.

To those trustees over the last fifteen years who have served the needs of the College with integrity, honesty, competence and discernment, aligned with a willingness to uphold the mission of the Catholic school. Thank you for your wisdom and support through the challenges and successes that we have encountered.

To the Marist Fathers who have served our Church, school and board for many years. Having your support and understanding over the years has been greatly appreciated. It has been an honour to carry and uphold the Marist charism at Pompallier Catholic College and to share in the wonderful legacy given to us by those young men who arrived from France almost 200 years ago to bring the Catholic faith to Aotearoa.

To my family who have been my greatest critics and greatest supporters. In bringing their wisdom, love, understanding and interest to all that I do, you have made every day an opportunity for rejoicing in the amazing gifts that God brings to me.
