Kia ora koutou katoa,

There's a scorpion that sits on my desk. I call him Spike. Spike doesn't usually move, unless I pick him up.

I found Spike at the Hoover Dam, on the Colorado and Nevada border. We were in a camper van, on our way to Big Bear Lake after indulging in the delights of Las Vegas. There he was, sitting on a shelf in a souvenir shop, fully encased in a resin dome. Spike was exquisite in detail, the light streaming through window of the shop and exposing all his majestic menace. The clear resin exaggerated and distorted his pincers and upright tail, depending on the angle from which you viewed him. To me, he was terrifyingly beautiful.

But, if I had seen Spike, sitting on a rock or scuttling across a path out in the open, you wouldn't have seen me for dust! I distrust all spiders, especially ones that could deliver a fatal sting to any part of my uncovered skin.

Safely surrounded by resin, Spike is no longer dangerous, just fascinating. Spike keeps a silent vigil from his dome desktop vantage point. He keeps my piles of paper in one steady stack. Spike sits on my desk as a provocation. As a way to engage, to evoke curiosity, looking at him from differing angles and domed distortions.

But that wasn't his purpose or choice. His habitat is in the dry desert rocks and sands, not in an airconditioned office on the other side of the world.

When we look at our students, we can't encase them in rigid boundaries and limiting expectations, giving them no room to move and turning them into passive observers and leaden paper holders.

We must look through Mary's eyes and accept the whole person, and that might mean stinging tail, sharp pincers and all. We must make sure that we remove their captive domes and see the potential, providing the right environment to enable them to flourish.

Thanks to everyone involved in this fun activity for our students, especially Sophie Jensen, our wonderful Art teacher who spends many hours helping students to create these treasures.








LEARNING CENTRE VISIT TO THE FIRE STATION ...
