Change is in the Air

The academic year is nearing its end here at Pompallier Catholic College. Year 9 and 10 end-ofyear exams have finished, Year 7 and 8 are completing final assessments for the year, and the NCEA exam season will conclude next Friday, 29 November. The remaining weeks of 2024 will focus on preparing students for the beginning of the 2025 academic year.

In addition, preparations are well underway, both here at Pompallier Catholic College and at the national level, for significant curriculum change. A refreshed Mathematics curriculum is being rolled out across the country next year for Years 0-8. An updated English curriculum will also begin for Years 0-6 in 2025, and will be extended into Year 7-8 in 2026. A significant aspect of these changes is the Teaching Council's decision to include new entry requirements for Primary teacher training programmes. This will take the form of an assessment where candidates will need to demonstrate mathematics competency equivalent to NCEA Level 2 Mathematics. While critics of the changes note the quickness of their implementation, the lifting of required teacher mathematics capacity is clearly a positive.

Elsewhere, in an address to the Northland Secondary Principals' Association on Friday 15 November, Minister of Education Erica Stanford signalled that a soon to be released review of NCEA will expose significant flaws and provide a roadmap forward. Given the decline of our national education system over the last 20 years when benchmarked against international standards, we can only be hopeful that this will result in a framework for positive change.

In the midst of this groundswell of change, I have seen in my first six weeks here at Pompallier Catholic College a strong foundation upon which to continue the mission of a Catholic Secondary School in the Marist Tradition: The pursuit of academic excellence, based upon the rock of faith in Christ, with the aspiration of living in the way of Mary: humility, work ethic, and active compassion.

Upon this foundation, Pompallier Catholic College is ready to embrace the change that is indeed in the air, as we look forward to the Christmas season and a new year of challenges and opportunities in 2025.
