

A MESSAGE FROM KIWIRAIL ...

We would like to let the community know that the regular scheduled freight trains have returned to the rail line between Kauri, just north of Whangārei, and Auckland.

Our key safety messages are:

- Always expect trains from at any time, from either direction.
- If you are in a car, always slow down as you're approaching a level crossing and be prepared to STOP.
- Look out for trains at all times, and obey all signs and signals.
- Stay off railway tracks and only ever cross at an official level crossing.

2025 BUS INFORMATION

Pompallier Catholic College buses will begin running from Wednesday 29 January 2025 on all of our school routes. However, the students who use other schools' buses to connect to ours should check with their bus company to confirm their start date.

There may be changes to bus services early in the new year to allow for changes in our school population. We do our best to accommodate as many of our students as possible, within the guidelines set by the Ministry of Education. All changes will be notified as soon as possible.

All services are under review by the Ministry of Education, and will be confirmed at the beginning of 2025. Once finalised, details will be available on the transport page of our college website.

A reminder that eligibility is dependent on where a student lives, available public services in the area, and loading limits.

Student ID's also double as your bus pass, and these will be issued in the first few weeks of the new year. Until then, no pass is required.

From 26 - 29 November, the Awa Run brought together young people with big hearts. Organised by the Young Marist Network in partnership with the Next Door Young Neighbours Trust, the event raised funds to help rural students achieve their NCEA levels.

With a *5am start* from school, the group set off with a mixture of nerves, excitement, and perhaps a bit of sleep deprivation. After touching down in rainy Palmerston North, the warm welcome of new faces quickly wiped away any apprehension. From there, it was onward to Whanganui, where the adventure truly began.

Over four unforgettable days, each student ran at least 50km along the stunning Whanganui River trail, visited two Maraes, celebrated Mass at the quaint St. Joseph's Church in Jerusalem (Hiruharama), and even bunked down in the convent-orphanage

Mother Suzanne Aubert started. Amid all this, they connected with students from across nine Marist schools, creating friendships that will last well beyond the finish line.

Pompallier Catholic College's students brought the spirit of the North to the event. They dug deep to help where needed, cheered on teammates, and rose to all challenges presented. Even a delayed return flight couldn't dampen their spirits; instead, it turned into a singalong of old-school classics, leaving everyone hoarse but buzzing!

Back to School 2025

HOW DO I ORDER MY STATIONERY?

We team up with OfficeMax to make Back to School easy!

We DO NOT issue stationery lists to students. This is because all your child's school stationery list requirements are uploaded online at myschool.co.nz, to make it easy for you to purchase your child's stationery requirements. Simply search for our school, select your child's class and/or subject lists and follow the instructions on the easy -to-use website.

Buying through OfficeMax MySchool also **earns School Rewards for our school**, which we can redeem for much needed educational supplies, equipment for our classrooms, or to help those students in need.

Stationery is delivered to your home (or a designated address) by courier. This means that ordering is quick and easy, stationery lists are not lost and the correct products are obtained.

OfficeMax also partners with Zip, so you can pay in 4 interest free payments over 6 weeks - and still get your order right away (conditions apply). Or you can pay by internet banking, credit card or debit card.

If you prefer, you can call the OfficeMax MySchool team on 0800 724 440, Monday to Friday, 8:30am to 5:00pm.

Delivery is free for orders over \$70.00 incl. GST. Rural delivery incurs a small additional fee.

The website will "go live" for ordering stationery on Friday 29 November.

We encourage you to order early to ensure your child has all their stationery requirements ready to go for the start of Term 1. Don't wait until mid-January - order now and avoid the back to school rush!

All students are expected to have their stationery requirements on the first day of Term 1 (Wednesday 29 January), as teaching will begin on that day.

TO ORDER ONLINE:

- Go to <u>www.myschool.co.nz</u>, enter Pompallier into the School Name field, then select Pompallier Catholic College.
- 2. Click on "View the Requirements List"
- 3. Enter students First Name, Last Name & Year Level
- 4. Select the subjects required on the year level list
- 5. Click the "View Requirements List" button
- 6. Review the list, adding or deleting items as required.
- 7. You now have the option to add another student, otherwise click "Extras"
- 8. Select anything else you would like to purchase, otherwise click "Shopping Cart"
 - If items are unavailable at the time you order, these will be placed on backorder and delivered to you as soon as they arrive. This will be indicated on your delivery docket
- 9. Review your list and if correct, click "Checkout"
- 10. Follow the online instructions to enter your delivery address details and payment options
- Save a copy of the order and retain it for your records. Note your Order Number, as this will be required if you need to return items

CONDITIONS:

- Please allow up to ten working days for delivery.
 Orders placed after 15 January 2025 may result in delays and OfficeMax cannot guarantee delivery before school starts on late orders.
