The school has been a hive of activity this week. Senior students are engaged in NCEA internals, trials for winter sport have been taking place, our athletes competed at the Northland Secondary Schools Track & Field Champs, we hosted a Careers Roadshow where students could cast an eye to their future careers. Hotly contested House Tug of War competitions have been taking place at lunchtime, our Kapa Haka group have been filling the college with rousing waiata and haka as they prepare for the Te Tai Tokerau festival next month, and our Year 12 and 13 Rōpū leaders have been active across the college showing leadership in Catholic Character, Tikanga Māori, service, and mentorship.

Northland Field Days 2025: A Valuable Learning Experience

On Friday 28 February, the senior business studies class attended the Northland Field Days in Dargaville, to gain valuable insights into local businesses. This trip was designed to support students in their upcoming NCEA marketing and motivational studies assessments. Students attended with prepared questionnaires and surveys, offering them a hands-on opportunity to learn from industry professionals, business owners, and members of the public.

The Field Days proved to be an interactive and engaging experience, allowing students to immerse themselves in the world of business. One of the most beneficial aspects of the visit was the chance to speak directly with business workers and receive their honest and helpful advice. Professionals from various industries shared their experiences, offering insights into what makes a business successful and how to navigate challenges. Despite the educational focus, there was plenty of fun to be had! Students enjoyed complimentary train rides, delicious takeaway foods and ice cream, while making the most of the day. With 18 students attending, there was a great sense of camaraderie and excitement throughout the trip. A particularly memorable moment was when some students, while collecting information, were interviewed and featured on the *NZ Herald* news page - an exciting and unexpected highlight of the experience!

Overall, attending the Northland Field Days 2025 was a valuable experience for the senior business studies class. It provided real-world exposure, fostered industry connections, and encouraged critical thinking about business development. The insights gained from this event will undoubtedly benefit students in their studies and future careers.
