Tēnā koutou katoa,

We woke today to news that Cardinal Robert Prevost has been elected as the 267th Pope of the Catholic Church. He will be known as Pope Leo XIV and is heralded as being in favour of Pope Francis and his reforms.

Pope Leo begins leading the church at a time of renewed spiritual search. St Patrick's Cathedral in Auckland made headlines recently for welcoming 350 new catechumens into the Church. The RCIA programme at St Francis Xavier has seen markedly increased interest in recent times. Other parishes around the country have experienced the same. Across the globe, France has been baptising record numbers of adult converts, including over 10,000 in 2025 and 7,000 in 2024.

These increased adult conversions depict people searching for a foundation in what many perceive as troubling and unstable times. This search leads to the very heart of the Gospel: Jesus of Nazareth and his message of hope. Though 140 years ago Friedrich Nietzsche pronounced "God is dead", a sentiment echoed in recent times by Richard Dawkins and the New Atheist movement, the Gospel of Jesus Christ continues to speak to the human condition.

We pray for God's blessing for our new Pope. May he be granted the wisdom and courage to fulfil his prayer for the church, offered earlier today in his first address as Pope Leo XIV:


"May we help each other to build bridges, with dialogue... uniting us all to be one people, always in peace."

NZ bishops celebrate election of Pope Leo XIV

The Catholic Church in Aotearoa New Zealand has received news of the election of Pope Leo XIV with great joy.

Bishop Steve Lowe, president of the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference, says there is trust in the Holy Spirit and the College of Cardinals that Pope Leo XIV is the right man to lead the global Church at this time.

On Friday morning NZ time, Cardinal Robert Prevost OSA was elected the new Pope, and took the name Leo.

He becomes the first North American Pope, but has spent much of his ministerial life overseas, predominantly in Peru. He is a member of a religious order – the Augustinians – and becomes the second consecutive Pope to have such a background, following the Jesuit Pope Francis.

"While a new Pope is often unknown to most people around the world, we know from his experience in leadership in Latin America, as a leader within his religious order and as prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for Bishops that Pope Leo understands the Church and its needs," Bishop Lowe said.

Bishop Lowe said the choice of the name Leo could offer a glimpse into the type of pope he seeks to be.

"In the coming days, we will learn more about Pope Leo XIV, but the last Pope to take this name helped develop some of the Church's key social teachings," he said.

A transformative encyclical letter, *Rerum Novarum*, was published in 1891, and has been the inspiration of many teaching documents in the years since.

In his blessing to the crowds in St Peter's Square, Pope Leo spoke about the importance of Catholics being willing to proclaim the Gospel, work for justice and peace, to be missionaries in the world.

New Zealand Catholics will immediately take up the practice of praying for the Pope in every Mass celebrated throughout the country.

"In parishes, in Catholic schools, in our outreach ministries and in Catholic homes, prayers will be offered for our new Holy Father, that God will provide him with all the strength needed for this immense task," Bishop Lowe said.

"There is a real sense among the faithful that the popes that have been elected in recent decades have had the right attributes to lead the Church at that moment. We trust that will be the same with Pope Leo XIV."

Wooden Wonders



Reanna Stratton and Helena lamafana have planned and constructed a business called **'Wooden Wonders'**, which consists of eco-friendly wooden puzzle toys for kids.

Children would be able to assemble the pieces at home, boosting their mental and physical ability to think and be active. We initially aimed to focus our target market on kids, but we expanded our business to better fit more people's interests, which will include **wooden chopping boards**, **wooden coasters**, **puzzle toys**, and **home decor** for adults and families. We will be using recycled wood from school and the laser cutter to develop our desired product.

The food was a delicious mixture of classic French cuisine with traditional Polynesian fare, washed down by bottles of orangina.

This trip was an unforgettable experience, enhanced by seeing the increase in confidence of students when speaking and understanding French and in the growth of their resilience and independence.
