Tēnā koutou katoa,

The education world is currently digesting the 2025 Budget news for our sector. A significant change is the scrapping of the Kahui Ako (Community of Learning) scheme, established by the National government in 2014, which will conclude at the end of this year. In its place, \$2.5 billion is being allocated to Learning Support. Minister of Education Erica Stanford argued today that the Kahui Ako scheme had failed to raise student achievement, and that investing in early intervention Learning Support will prove to be more effective.

At Pompallier Catholic College, we have been proactively investing in Learning Support for many years. Our achievement rates suggest that this commitment is paying off. Beyond academic gains, Learning Support also plays a key pastoral role. Academic coaching, much like in the sporting arena, provides significant opportunities for connection and role modelling.

The ending of the Kahui Ako scheme will understandably be met with disappointment and criticism. It has undeniably brought schools out of their silos to discuss teaching and learning collaboratively. However, it is difficult to fault a greater investment in Learning Support, particularly when our education system has been declining against international standards for more than 20 years.
