# Father Brian Thomas Wysocki SM RIP

It is with sadness that we acknowledge the passing of the first Rector of Pompallier Catholic College, Fr Brian Wysocki. Fr Brian served as Rector from 1971 - 1976.

He then went on to spend time as staff (and later Rector) of St Patrick's College in Wellington and St Bede's College in Christchurch. He had many other roles during his ministry; some of which included 4 years as Executive Secretary Bishops' Conference, 5 years as Superior at General House in Rome, and 4 years as Superior & Parish Priest at St Mary of the Angels in Wellington.

Though retired for some years, Fr Brian returned to Pompallier Catholic College for the 50<sup>th</sup> Jubilee celebrations in 2021, and remained very active until recently. He kept in touch with Marists and other friends through phone calls and visits. Fr Brian's health declined rapidly over the past couple of weeks, and he died peacefully on Monday 16 June, at 93 years of age.

#### "Matariki hunga nui - Matariki of many people"

This proverb acknowledges how Matariki brings people together. It speaks to the communal aspect of the celebration, where whānau, hapū, and iwi gather to remember those who have passed, celebrate the present, and plan for the future.

In 2025 the national theme for Matariki is about "inclusion, embracing diversity and celebrating the season together". Our 2025 Matariki celebration was a tremendous success, bringing together around 600 students, whānau, and community members for a memorable evening of culture, connection and reflection. The vibrant turnout and enthusiastic participation showcased the strength of our school community, the strength of our special character, and our shared commitment to honouring Aotearoa's rich traditions. ### **PUANGA MATARIKI CELEBRATION**

Matariki signals the beginning of the Māori New Year. However, iwi Māori in some locations favour the rise of Puanga because Matariki sits low in the eastern horizon and is therefore not always visible from their location.

Puanga (Rigel) is the star most recognised in Tai Tokerau, as the signal of a new year. It is not one of the stars in the Matariki cluster and can be seen shining brightly just above Tautoru (the three bottom stars of 'the pot' or Orion's Belt).

Each year Pompallier Catholic College staff and students tautoko Matua Fred Tito at this annual gathering that acknowledges the past, welcomes in the new year, and celebrates the whanaungatanga within the Onerahi community.

### STUDENT VOLUNTEER ARMY

Last Wednesday at assembly I had the honour of presenting two wonderful students with silver and gold pins for the Student Volunteer Army.

On September 4<sup>th</sup> 2010, a 7.1 magnitude earthquake struck Canterbury, New Zealand, causing widespread damage - particularly in the city of Ōtautahi Christchurch. In the wake of the disaster, 11,000 students mobilised to help with the clean-up - coordinated by their founder, Sam Johnson.

# This was the beginning of the Student Volunteer Army (SVA).

The SVA supports young people across Aotearoa to engage in meaningful volunteering. The programmes align with the UN Sustainable Development Goals and include:

- Service Award Programme: Operating in 258 schools and recognising 20,000+ students for their volunteering efforts.
- Ambassador Programme: Empowering student leaders to champion service in their communities.
- University Clubs: Student-led groups active across Aotearoa New Zealand, especially during crisis responses.
- SVA App: A platform for logging hours and discovering community-led initiatives.

The **GOLD** award went to **Samuel Davidson (Year 12)** for 500 hours of volunteering – his volunteering included working at a soup kitchen, coaching gymnastics and being involved in Youth Theatre.

The **SILVER award** went to **Jamie Cramer (Year 13)** for 250 hours of volunteering in the I Have a Dream organisation and work with his previous primary school.

Anyone who is volunteering can take part. A great way to see your volunteering hours grow and use the information for applying for jobs or for university/ scholarship applications.
