Tēnā koutou katoa,

The government's recent announcement regarding the proposed replacement of NCEA has likely come to your attention. Should this proposal proceed, it will be the most significant change to our secondary education qualifications since the introduction of NCEA more than 20 years ago.

The changes can be summarised as follows:

- NCEA Levels 1, 2 and 3 will be replaced with the following:
 - ⇒ Year 11: 'Foundational Skills Award' with Literacy and Numeracy emphasis, starting in 2028
 - ⇒ Year 12: New Zealand Certificate of Education, starting in 2029
 - ⇒ Year 13: New Zealand Advanced Certificate of Education, starting in 2030
- The Certificate of Education and Advanced Certificate of Education will require students to take a minimum of five subjects in Year 12 and Year 13, and to pass four of them to be awarded the qualification.
- There will be a mixture of internal (sat at school, during the year) and external (end of year exams) assessments. Each subject will be marked out of a total of 100 (internal and external marks combined). Students will be given overall letter grades (A-E) to designate levels of achievement.
- There will be a vocations pathway, with subjects such as Hard Materials and Food Technology. These subjects
 will also be marked out of 100 and will be counted toward the NZ Certificate and NZ Advanced Certificate of
 Education.

The proposed changes seek to simplify the attainment of qualifications, cater for students heading into tertiary study, the trades and the world of work, and increase overall educational rigour. That is, the qualifications will be more difficult to attain, as it would appear that all students must sit external exams in order to achieve.

There is now a consultation period regarding the changes that closes 15 September. We have begun discussing the proposal here at Pompallier Catholic College, and will be planning our own response. I encourage you to learn more about the changes by seeing the information for parents and caregivers here, and to take the opportunity to have your say here.

If the proposals are adopted, Year 8 students will be the first year level to sit the new qualification system when they reach Years 11-13. Our current Year 9 students will complete their schooling entirely under the current NCEA system.

Here at Pompallier Catholic College we will prepare for any coming changes by holding fast to our roots: Our Marist Catholic Character is the foundation upon which we build a strong academic culture, with teachers who are subject experts and who know what pedagogy engages our young men and women. This is the basis upon which we will plan for any changes that are made to our national qualification systems.

Please note:

- Congratulations to our young Pompallier Catholic College thespians for an outstanding performance of Macbeth this week! You have the opportunity to see this remarkable performance on Friday 8 August at 7pm in our drama room!
- Congratulations also to our Pompallier Catholic College Team of the Week: Our Senior Boys Collegiate Basketball Team for winning the NSSSA Basketball competition and for a convincing win over Huanui last week.
- Our Netball girls are in action tomorrow in semi finals and play-offs at the Whangārei Netball Centre, at 11am and 1pm.

REUBEN O'NEILL BURSARY

Auckland Common Fund Ltd is very pleased to share the Reuben O'Neill Bursary for 2026. Reuben and Alice O'Neill both passed away earlier this year, Alice in January and Reuben a few months later. Their generosity of spirit and deep faith continue to inspire and touch the lives of many. May they rest in eternal peace.

The Reuben O'Neill Bursary has been established by the Catholic Diocese of Auckland to assist in making Catholic education available to some families and their children who otherwise would be unable to receive a Catholic education. The Reuben O'Neill Bursary has been established to honour Reuben O'Neill, who was an exceptional volunteer and supporter of Catholic education throughout his lifetime. Reuben O'Neill (1932-2025) was a husband, parent and grandparent and was recognised by Pope John Paul II in 1989 receiving a papal knighthood for his services to the Catholic Church of New Zealand. Reuben was proud of his own Catholic education and worked faithfully to make Catholic education accessible to as many people as possible, through building the Common Fund Cooperative, developing new schools, and improving the standard of existing schools across the Diocese of Auckland.

Whānau/families can apply at primary or secondary levels. Eligibility criteria include a desire for Catholic education for their child, and financial benefit to their family. Students of any year level can apply for the scholarship.

In 2025 5 primary and 5 secondary bursaries were awarded and are for the duration of a student's time at primary or secondary school. In 2026 an additional 5 primary and 5 secondary bursaries will be offered. It may be a family whose child is already enrolled in a Catholic school, or someone you know who desires a Catholic education for their child but for whom the associated cost of Attendance Dues are a barrier.

Pastoral Coordinator St Patrick & St Joseph Cathedral


