"To get to easy, you have to go through hard. If it was easy, everyone would be winners - but it's the hard that builds character." So said guest speaker Steven Beazley at our inaugural Year 7-13 Sports Prizegiving yesterday.

Not only did Steve's words resonate with our audience of young Pompallier Catholic College athletes, they also aligned with our Catholic Marist values of humility and work ethic. Steve went on to extol the values of work, saying that "Discipline is doing the mahi even when no one's watching. It's showing up, every time."

Sport is fundamentally about community, about bringing people together, and about developing young people. The college is immensely grateful to all those who have contributed to Pompallier Catholic College sport in 2025.

This help has enabled the following Pompallier Catholic College sport participation this year:

- 295 students playing sport, many across multiple codes
- Representation in Football, Basketball, Netball, Hockey, Volleyball, Athletics, Rowing, Gymnastics, Equestrian, Futsal, Touch, Golf and more
- These young athletes have been supported by nearly 30 coaches, 10 of which have been senior students

There have also been some notable highlights, including:

- Our Collegiate Boys Basketball team being crowned Whangarei champions
- ♦ A record 4 teams heading to Tauranga for the AIMS Games, with Pompallier Catholic College fielding teams in Football, Basketball, Netball and Hockey. We were also represented in Cross Country and Gymnastics, in which we had our very first medal in, with Maeve Ryan winning bronze
- Our mixed 1st XI Hockey were runners-up in the Woolaston Trophy

And can I also acknowledge some outstanding achievements of Pompallier Catholic College athletes that were acknowledged last night.

All-Round Sporting Achievement:

- * Year 7-8: Ifeoluwa Falope for selection for the U14 Northland Basketball Squad and for being our Swimming and Cross Country Champion this year.
- * Year 9-10: Malachy Smedley for selection in the Northland Secondary Schools Track and Field Team at the North Island Championships, for being our Swimming and Athletics Champion this year, and setting two new school Athletics records.
- * Years 11-13: Zoe Roberts for achieving Player of the Season for Football, and Most Outstanding Senior Netball Player, and for her captaincy of both sides.

Colours: Colours are our highest sporting award, given to athletes selected for Northland at the highest level or for being selected for New Zealand Representation.

- Anna Hewitt for New Zealand representation in Gymnastics
- Jessica Kalkhoven for New Zealand representation in Gymnastics
- * Te Rauroha Paki for being selected to swim in the New Zealand Youth team and for currently holding 6 New Zealand records
- * William Gross for New Zealand Secondary Schools U19 Football representation and being a member of the winning Northland Men's Football team



NZ TERTIARY COLLEGE


Postgraduate Diploma in Teaching (Secondary)

This establishes a formal partnership to collaboratively support the Schools Onsite Training Programme (SOTP), aimed at the professional preparation of student-teacher candidates. The programme combines in-school professional experience with online academic study. Upon completion, graduates are eligible to apply for New Zealand teacher registration.

NCEA me te Whānau workshop registrations

The NCEA me te Whānau team would like to invite you to book our upcoming workshops for Term 4, 2025. Given the examination season is approaching, these workshops will <u>ONLY</u> be available during the first 4 weeks of Term 4 (from <u>Monday 6 October</u> to <u>Thursday 30 October</u>).

How our workshops are designed:

Workshops are 1-hour long and can be delivered in-person* or online. The NCEA me te Whānau workshop is delivered in the evening when whānau are available to attend. Ākonga workshops are offered during school hours.

*Note: In-person delivery is subject to the availability of a kaihāpai (facilitator) in your area or region at the date/time requested.

How to request a workshop:

If you would like to host a workshop, please complete our registration form by scanning the QR code or clicking <u>here</u>.

Once the registration has been received, a member of our team will be in touch to confirm dates and other arrangements.

In Term 4, we will be offering the following workshops:

- NCE A-Z is designed to ensure ākonga are wellprepared for NCEA. This workshop focusses on essential information that ākonga can quickly grasp, instilling confidence within themselves to embark on their NCEA journey.
- <u>Tertiary Prep</u> is designed to ensure <u>akonga</u> are present to the considerations and decisions they may need to make when considering tertiary study.
- NCEA me te Whānau is designed to assist parents and caregivers in supporting their tamaiti. It covers every crucial aspect of NCEA and offers guidance on how to help their tamaiti make informed subject choices.
