Tēnā koutou katoa,

This coming weekend, the Board of Trustees is taking part in workshops for the purpose of creating a new strategic plan for the college. I want to thank the community for their input into this process via the recent surveys. Key feedback from these surveys will be guiding our process this weekend.

A telling result from the survey came in some remarkable similarities between staff, students, and parents when it comes to visioning the characteristics we hope to develop in our young people through their time at Pompallier Catholic College. 'Faith-filled' was the second most chosen word across all three surveyed groups. This striking synchronicity across the school community pays testament to a shared valuing of our Catholic, Marist Character. Other top priorities included:

- 'Honest' is of number one importance for parents, third for staff, and fourth for students.
- 'Dependable' is number one for staff, third for parents, and fifth for students.
- 'Supportive' comes in third for students and fourth for staff.

Also of note, 'Courageous' takes first place for students, while it doesn't feature in the top five for parents and staff. This is a timely reminder that our young people face challenges that require courage. Our planning for the future of Pompallier Catholic College needs to keep this in mind.

When it comes to where we want to be in five years' time, **excelling in academics is in the top two for staff, students, and parents**. Also of note:

- Modernising our facilities comes in as a number one priority for students.
- Being innovative and progressive takes the top spot for staff.
- Having a caring and supportive community features in the top five across all three surveyed groups.

Overall, I see a unified vision from the community: to, upon the foundation of our Catholic Marist Character, honour our commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, promote academic excellence, foster a caring, supportive, and connected community, modernise our facilities, and enhance our arts, sporting, and cultural programmes.


